The Dangers of Webcams - A webcam is a video camera that is connected to a user's computer and is most often positioned on top of the user's computer monitor. When activated in conjunction with an online service, the webcam will permit the user to transmit video images of himself or herself to others in real time. Webcams can be a source of convenience and amusement for viewing friends from other schools or relatives who live out of state. Unfortunately, due to its use by child molesters who search the Internet for unsuspecting children, the webcam is the single most dangerous peripheral device that can be attached to a child's or young person's computer. Prior to connecting a webcam or a microphone to a computer, specific rules should be established to help protect the safety of everyone involved.

Dear Members of St. Joseph's Parish,

Army Captain David Roselle lost his right foot when the humvee in which he was riding hit an anti-tank mine in Iraq. Roselle was airlifted to an army hospital in Germany, and later to Walter Reed where he worked hard to walk again. After taking leave to be at the birth of his son in Colorado, Captain Roselle returned to his command post in Iraq. He wanted to finish the job that he had started. Other wounded military personnel have done the same. They are going back to finish the job they started.

The highest form of courage belongs to those who won't quit. Real courage means being perfectly aware of the worst that can happen, yet doing the right thing anyway.

In raising Lazarus from the dead in today's Gospel, Jesus set in motion his own crucifixion and burial. "So from that day on they planned to kill him." (John 11:53) He set His face toward Jerusalem, and to His suffering and death.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer, the German pastor who resisted the Nazis during the Second World War, and was murdered by them, opens his book, The Cost of Discipleship, with these words: "When Christ calls a man, He bids him come and die."

Speaking of death, the pastor was visiting a terminally ill parishioner in the hospital. As he started consoling the patient the sick man said: "Don't worry about where I am heading to, Father. I have friends in both places."

FIVE FINGER PRAYER FOR LENT

! Your thumb is nearest you. So begin your prayers by praying for those closest to you. They are the easiest to remember. To pray for our loved ones is, as C. S. Lewis once said, a 'sweet duty.'

! The next finger is the pointing finger. Pray for those who teach, instruct and heal. This includes teachers, doctors, priests and deacons. They need support and wisdom in pointing others in the right direction. Keep them in your prayers.

! The next finger is the tallest finger. It reminds us of our leaders. Pray for the president, national, state and local leaders, employers and administrators. These people shape our nation and guide public opinion. They need God's guidance.

! The fourth finger is our ring finger. Surprising to many is the fact that this is our weakest finger, as any piano teacher will testify. It should remind us to pray for those who are weak, in trouble or in pain. They need your prayers day and night. You cannot pray too much for them.

! And lastly comes our little finger - the smallest finger of all which is where we should place ourselves in relation to God and others. As the Bible says, 'The least should be the greatest among you. This finger should remind you to pray for yourself. By the time you have prayed for the other four groups, your own needs will be put into perspective.
