<u>Child Abuse Prevention Month</u> Who Are the Abusers? - Estimates are that approximately 60% of abusers are men, 15 to 20% are women, and 20 to 40% are men and women acting together. So while men are indeed the majority of sexual abusers, it is dangerous to underestimate the risk that female sexual abusers also pose to children. Among educators, 57.2% of abusers are male, and 42.4% of abusers are female. Help Reduce Abuse Statistics - Nationally, more than 2 million reports of abuse or neglect of minors are made each year. Only a small percentage of child abuse is ever reported. Learn how to spot suspected abuse or neglect, and how to report it to the proper authorities. If you haven't already done so, consider participating in the next "Protecting God's Children" program.

Dear Members of St. Joseph's Parish,

Today we begin Holy Week, and the most important liturgical celebration in our Catholic Church. Passion, or Palm Sunday, commemorates Jesus' arrival at the Holy City, Jerusalem. We remember all the predictions of his suffering and death that he made to his disciples during his three years among them, and we wonder now what exactly is he feeling as he ponders his final days.

On Palm Sunday, the crowd in Jerusalem is exuberant with joy, as the long-expected Messiah arrives to inaugurate the Kingdom of God. Some days later that joy will turn into anger as Jesus fails to live up to their expectations. They are so disappointed with him that they choose to have a terrorist released from custody, rather than Jesus of Nazareth.

I invite you to participate in the liturgies of Holy Week to the extent you can, and especially the liturgies of the Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil).

The Mass of Holy Thursday (at 7:00 pm) will commemorate the institution of the Eucharist, the institution of the sacramental priesthood, and the call to Christian service ('the Washing of the Feet'). Recalling the time spent

by Jesus in prayer in the garden of Gethsemane following the Last Supper, we will have Adoration until 10:00 pm).

Good Friday is the only day in the Catholic calendar when Mass is not permitted. Instead, we receive Holy Communion that has been consecrated the night before. On Good Friday our liturgy begins at 4:00 pm with Outdoor Stations of the Cross. At the conclusion we will gather then in the church for Veneration of the Cross and Holy Communion. The Spanish liturgy will be at 6:30 pm.

By tradition, the Easter Vigil cannot begin before dark, and so on Holy Saturday night we will begin with the lighting of the Paschal Candle in front of the church at 8:00 PM. This is the Mass in which we receive our new members through the Sacraments of Initiation.

The Easter Sunday Masses are at the normal times, with the addition of a second Mass, at 10:00 am, in Mater Dei Hall.

Your last opportunity for confession before Easter will be this Tuesday, at 5:30 pm, as there will be no confessions on Holy Saturday.

May each one of us be renewed spiritually during this holiest of weeks, and in a special way may the many in our knowledge who are sick receive a special blessing in this sacred time. God bless, Father Dan
