Dear Members of St. Joseph's Parish,

Chris Moretz decided to ride out Hurricane Katrina alone at home. After the worst of the storm had passed, his house was flooded and destroyed. Chris needed to let his family know that he was still alive. But they were in Tucson, Arizona, and there was no way for him to contact them. So Chris painted the message on the roof of his home: "C. MORETZ IS ALIVE. PASS IT ON." Also included was the phone number of Chris's brother, Gerard. Gerard said, "Going 36 hours not knowing if he was OK puts things in perspective. But then Chris' rooftop message was shown on TV and posted on some web sites. Chris' family began getting phone calls from all over the country telling them that Chris was alive.

We live in a Good Friday world, but we are an Easter People. We look at the world in a positive way. Through the Cross of Christ we see a world which is illuminated by the light shining forth from the Empty Tomb.

For the early Church, the message was simple: "JESUS IS ALIVE. PASS IT ON." For us Catholics on this Easter Sunday, the message is the same, "JESUS IS ALIVE. PASS IT ON."

### **BEATIFICATION OF POPE JOHN PAUL II**

The late and beloved Pope John Paul II will be beatified in the Vatican next Sunday, Divine Mercy Sunday. It is an appropriate day to celebrate as the celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday was instituted by him, in honor of the canonization of St. Faustina, who revealed this image of Jesus to the Church. It became part of the Catholic liturgical calendar during the Jubilee Year of 2000.

This beatification takes place only a few years after the death of this Pope, signaling that throughout the Catholic world many people expressed a hope that the path to sainthood might be shortened, in his case. From Divine Mercy Sunday, then, he will be known as Blessed John Paul II, and the process toward full sainthood, or canonization, will continue.

In recognition of this special event I have ordered a special medal for each parishioner, to be distributed at Mass on Divine Mercy Sunday.
