Science prompted him to publicly profess in 1974 that as director of "the largest abortion clinic in the Western world," I had "in fact presided over 60,000 deaths." He presented that reality in his film, "The Silent Scream" that captured the image of an unborn child shrinking from the surgical instruments of an abortionist, an image that Nathanson called, "the silent scream of a child threatened imminently with extinction." Dear Members of St. Joseph's Parish:

From the beginnings of Christianity the making of a spiritual pilgrimage has had a special place in the life of the believing community. Before the Church was able to be legally visible in public in Rome, the believers met underground in the catacombs, and it was there that they buried the martyrs, those who died for the faith. The tombs of the martyrs became a place for pilgrimage, when Christians would visit and pray, inviting the intercession of the martyr who was interred, because it was believed that these martyrs were now with their Lord in Heaven.

When the Christian faith spread to Europe, many believers wanted to make a pilgrimage to the Holy Land, and to pray at those places associated with the earthly life of Christ and the Blessed Mother. Most popular was the pilgrimage to the city of Jerusalem itself, and in particular the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, encompassing the site of the crucifixion, and the tomb of Christ's resurrection. From this developed the "Stations of the Cross", where pilgrims would walk in the footsteps of Christ on the day of his crucifixion, from the court of Pontius Pilate to the hill of Calvary.

In the Middle Ages, when the Moslems drove out the Christians and occupied the Holy Land, it was no longer possible to make a pilgrimage there. In turn, this led to the Stations of the Cross being placed in Catholic churches in Europe - if people were denied the opportunity to journey to the Holy Land, then, in a sense, the Holy Land came to Europe in the form of the Stations of the Cross.

The purpose of a pilgrimage is not just to enhance the spiritual life of the believer, but also to bring blessings to those who could not journey with the pilgrim, especially the sick.

On September 7 we begin our parish pilgrimage to Rome and Italy. For those of you not traveling I want to take your special prayer intentions with me, and place them in prayer at the tomb of St. Peter and the tomb of Blessed Pope John Paul II in the Basilica of St. Peter's.

There is a special intentions box located at the church entrance. Please write out your intentions and place the paper in the box. Please do this before September 6 so that I can pack them for the journey.

Traveling with us also will be some of the ashes of the late Nora Hatfield. She so much wanted to be on this pilgrimage, but knew that she would not be alive by then. We agreed before her death that I would take some of her ashes to Rome and scatter them in that sacred place.

On another matter I would like you to consider assisting with our Religious Education Program (CCD). At the moment we need volunteers to assist with Grades 1, 3, 5 & 7. You may not feel that you have the qualifications necessary, but believe me it is not a difficult commitment, and you will get excellent support from our DRE, Cathy, and from the teacher's guide that will help you prepare for your class. I assure you that you will grow in your own spiritual life as a result of interacting with our young children and assisting them in understanding our Catholic faith.
