Dear Members of St. Joseph's Parish:

Have you ever "gone across the sea to Ireland?" If not, you are invited to join my friend Fr. Oliver (Our Lady of Tahoe Parish, Zephyr Cove, NV) and me on a Spiritual Journey to Ireland, for 10 days, June 14-23, 2012.

The first two days we will participate in the 50th. International Eucharistic Congress in Dublin, which may be visited by Pope Benedict. We will 'quietly' slip away from the prayers to visit the famous Guinness Brewery and witness the making of that special brew! The rest of the trip will take us across from Dublin to Galway, with Mass at the Shrine of Our Lady of Knock. From Galway, we drive south through the famous Burren in County Clare, crossing the river Shannon into County Kerry. We will travel the famous Ring of Kerry and see the Lakes of Killarney. Our next stop will be my county, County Cork, with an opportunity to kiss the Blarney Stone. In Cork city we will visit the famous English Market, recently visited by Queen Elizabeth of England during her Irish tour. We will visit the harbor town of Cobh, the last port of call for the liner 'Titanic' before she sank with great loss of life. It will be the centenary year of the sinking of the 'Titanic', making it a special time to visit the memorial. For those of you whose ancestors came from Ireland, most of them departed for the United States from the port of Cobh, then known as Queenstown. Also in Cobh are buried many of the passengers of the liner 'Lusitania,' which sank off the Old Head of Kinsale in 1915 by a German U boat, and was responsible for the United States entering the First World War.

Still in County Cork, we move on to Midleton, the home of Irish whiskey, and will tour the distillery where the whiskey is made, and even try a sample or two (the 'Jameson Experience'). We will stay two nights in County Cork at the Castlemartyr resort, a beautifully restored country estate. From there it is a short drive to my home town of Youghal, an old seaport, which was used in the filming of the movie "Moby Dick." The town is still surrounded by ancient fortified walls. Sir Walter Raleigh was once mayor of the town and his residence is still occupied and in good shape. It is said that he smoked the first tobacco in Europe here. A maidservant, seeing him enveloped in smoke, thought he was on fire and threw a bucket of water over him to quench the flames! The first potato in Europe was also planted by him in his garden.

We leave County Cork and drive up through County Waterford, past Lismore Castle, the Irish seat of the Duke of Devonshire, then into County Tipperary (its not really "a long way to Tipperary"), stopping for Mass at the beautiful Holy Cross Abbey, an ancient medieval church. A special stop will be at the famous Trappist (Cistercian) abbey - Mount Melleray. This is where Fr. Oliver studied for the priesthood. It is no longer a seminary, but the monks still carry out their daily routine of work and prayer.

Next is the Rock of Cashel, home of the High Kings of Ireland, rising majestically above the plains of Tipperary. Queen Elizabeth also visited there recently. Our tour brings us back to Dublin for a special banquet and an evening of music and song.

The pricing and color brochure for this spiritual journey is currently being prepared by our tour company, Catholic Travel Center, with which I have been associated for 20 years. Please call the parish office if you would like to receive a brochure when it becomes available shortly. The tour pricing includes travel (out of Salt Lake City or Reno), a private bus and tour guide, hotel accommodations and most meals, and entry fees to the places we visit. We also add an amount to cover tips, so we don't have to tip when we are there. Sometimes there is a fuel surcharge, depending on the economy.

Fr. Oliver and I are very much looking forward to taking you around our country, the Emerald Isle!

Present Text-Apostles's Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead

On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand **of the Father.**

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and **the** life everlasting. Amen.
