Dear Members of the Catholic Community:

It looks like we survived the transition to the new Roman Missal - and with your spirit! I am sure you are finding that the pew cards are helpful in getting used to the new responses. The choir also put a lot of work into preparing the parts of the Mass that are sung, and I thank them for their effort.

As you know, Christmas Day will fall on a Sunday this year. Many of you will attend either the Children's Mass on Christmas Eve at 4 pm or the later traditional Christmas Eve Mass at 10 pm. Theses masses take care of your 'Sunday obligation', so there is no need to return again next day, Sunday, although you are most welcome to do so as we operate the regular Sunday schedule.

Today we begin the second part of Advent, and our focus changes a little to meditate on the first coming of Christ, as a child born to Mary. Today is called "Gaudete" Sunday. This is a Latin word, translated it means "Rejoice", and it echoes today's second reading from Thessalonians which begins, "Brothers and Sisters: Rejoice always." Paul is not just talking about emotions or feeling good all the time. That is not possible. It is more about having a deep faith and hope in eternal life.

In 1944, a German Jesuit, Fr. Alfred Delp was arrested after Claus von Stauffenberg's attempt to assassinate Hitler. Fr. Delp was not part of the plot, but he was a member of the Kreisau Circle, a movement to reorganize Germany according to Christian principles. He was imprisoned during Advent. From prison he wrote: "May the time never come when men forget about the good tidings and promises, when so immured within the four walls of their prison, they see nothing but gray days through barred windows placed too high to see out of." Fr. Delp reminded us to rejoice always, and not just in the good times.

Fr. Delp was hanged on February 2, 1945. In the Christian calendar this is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. On this day candles are blessed in every church to recall the prophecy made by Simeon in the Temple that Christ is the Light of the World. And today in the Gospel, John the Baptist states that he is called to give testimony to that light.

In that light, let us try to "rejoice always", even when it gets a little tough out there! God bless, Father Dan
