Dear Members of the Catholic Community:

On this Fourth Sunday of Advent the readings of the Mass remind us of how God is faithful to His commitments, and that he can use flawed or insignificant people to bring about his purposes.

In the First Reading we meet the great, but flawed, King David, who in today's language might be accused of manslaughter. He deliberately sent one of his military commanders to a certain death, so that he could take that man's wife, Bathsheba, as his own. David could do so because his human power was immense. He is chastised by God, but still God will use David to bring about our salvation - the messiah will be "of the house of David, that is, he will be a descendent of David (the Virgin Mary's husband, Joseph, is a descendent of David).

David lives in a great palace, and his one desire is to build a beautiful Temple for God, a place to enthrone the Ten Commandments in the 'holy of holies.' God reminds David that He cannot be contained or confined in a certain place only, but is everywhere found by those who seek Him.

David wants to build a Temple, but the virgin Mary becomes a Temple - the angel Gabriel, in today's Gospel, tells her that her womb will become the Temple or dwelling place of God.

David sinned greatly, but God still loved him and included him in his plan. Mary is sinless and lives a very normal, humble life in an insignificant town called Nazareth. Unlike David, who wanted to "confine" God in a Temple, as soon as Mary's "confinement" of nine months is complete, the Son of God she gives birth to will be given to all peoples.

This is what we will celebrate in the coming week, beginning on this Saturday, Christmas Eve. We will have two Children's Masses at 4 PM, in the Church and in Mater Dei Hall. Later that evening the traditional 'Midnight Mass' is celebrated at 10 PM. The Spanish community will present a "Pastorella" at 7 PM, which is a retelling of the Christmas story. Because Christmas Day falls on a Sunday, the regular Sunday Mass schedule will be observed. For the first time Christmas Mass will be celebrated in our new Spring Creek chapel at 4 PM on Christmas Day.

Christmas does bring out the best in people. If you know of any "fallen away" Catholic, why not invite him/her to Christmas Mass? Similarly, if you know someone who does not belong to or attend any church, tell them that they are welcome to St. Joseph's.
