


Dear Members of St. Joseph's Parish:

Time indeed does pass quickly! This past weekend marks three years since I came to Elko as pastor, and two years since Fr. Hermes arrived to minister here. Earlier this year all priests in the diocese received a letter from the Personnel Board with a form requesting information if the priest wishes to remain in his assignment, or should be considered for a move to another assignment (all moves take effect on July 1 each year). Both Fr. Hermes and I indicated that we wished to remain in our present assignment. I am really pleased that Fr. Hermes is to continue his ministry here, as I very much value the unique contribution he makes to parish life, and his constant willingness to assist with whatever needs to be accomplished. We have both seen many changes in parish life, hopefully for the best, during our time here, and we both look forward to continuing to be of service during the coming year.

There has only been one assignment change in the diocese, and that is in Winnemucca. Fr. Pepe (Jose), who served here some years ago, is now the Administrator there, since Fr. DonDon was permitted to serve in the Air Force as a chaplain. It was very gracious of Bishop Calvo to "let him go", given that we do not have an excess of clergy. Bishop Calvo will be with us here in Elko on October 16, when he will bless our new chapel in Spring Creek, and also will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation for our Spanish-speaking adults - they are currently being prepared during weekly 2-hour sessions. As the new national census has indicated, the Hispanic population here in Elko has risen dramatically in the last 10 years. Of course we did not need the census to tell us that, as we know from our ministry here how that portion of our parish membership is rising all the time. Recently, when we celebrated four First Holy Communion Masses, the programs revealed that approximately 70% of the children were Hispanic. It is always this second generation of immigrant children who blend more completely into the larger Catholic community, particularly as from a young age they are exposed to English, especially through school. That we why we have no need in our parish to offer children's catechism in Spanish, as they already speak English fluently. I have noticed also that many of our Hispanic families worship at our English Masses, rather than the Spanish Mass. Still, the Spanish Mass is very crowded each Sunday.

We are really in need of support for our music ministry. We have lost some choir members, who moved, and it would be good if we could get some volunteers to step up to the plate. It would be an even greater thing if we could get some more musicians to help with leading us in song. If you know of any such musicians in the community, please encourage them to give of their time!

I hope you continue to enjoy the summer. God bless, Father Dan

#### NEW PRAYERS, SAME MASS

Beginning with the First Sunday of Advent in 2011, Catholics around the U.S. will worship using the new English translation of the Roman Missal, Third Edition. The most noticeable changes are in the Order of Mass and the priest's prayers. "And also with you" becomes "And with your spirit." "We believe" becomes "I believe," and "one in being" becomes "consubstantial." Though some words are new, the Mass itself is not changing. As the U.S. bishops remind us, this is an opportunity for liturgical and spiritual renewal. Learning to pray with new words, we enter into the mystery of the Eucharist with greater awareness and appreciation.
