Dear Members of St. Joseph's Parish:

During our Independence Day celebrations you might hear all or part of the poem inscribed on the Statue of Liberty: "Give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses yearning to breathe free... Send these, the homeless tempest-tossed to me." Today's Scripture readings, especially the gospel, give the same message in a more powerful way: "Take my yoke...and you will find rest."

In Jesus' time, oxen were linked together by means of a wooden yoke across their necks. St. Joseph the carpenter, and Jesus, probably made both yokes and plows. "There is a legend that Jesus made the best ox-yokes in all of Galilee, and that from all over the country men came to him to buy the best yokes that skill could make. In those days, as now, shops had their signs above the door; and it has been suggested that the sign above the door of the carpenter's shop in Nazareth may well have been: "My yokes fit well." It may well be that Jesus, in today's gospel, is using a picture from the carpenter's shop in Nazareth where he had worked throughout the silent years" (William Barclay).

A yoke that is endured by many these days is that of cancer. Last weekend, it was great to see so many parish members participate in the relay for life at the High school track. In particular, Jody Barnhart put so much effort into organizing the team representing our parish, and we thank her for that.

May each one of us enjoy a restful and happy Independence Day, as we keep in mind and prayer those who serve in uniform and are engaged in preserving our many freedoms..
