Dear Members of St. Joseph's Parish:

Today's gospel, from St. Matthew, tells the familiar story of the miracle feeding of the five thousand. From what initially seemed to be an impossible task - satisfying the hunger of a multitude with only five loaves of bread and two fish - is made possible by the prayer invocation of Jesus to His Father in Heaven. God the Father is abundant in his giving - at the end of the meal there are twelve baskets filled with the leftovers. Good acting on the generosity of those who gave the five loaves and two fish, and multiplied that generosity so that the many could benefit.

This gospel is appropriate as I reflected on the visit to our parish last week of Father Liam Reilly, who spoke to us about his mission in Guayaquil, Ecuador, and the extreme poverty that is the reality of the people who live there. The work of Fr. Liam and his companions is not just to feed, but to develop the resources that will enrich the lives of the people and give them encouragement to raise themselves up from poverty into a better life. And so, his priestly work there, as a member of the Society of St. James, is largely dedicated to providing, not loaves and fishes, but resources such as child care centers and medical facilities, and projects to give job skills to people who have not benefitted from a High School education.

Of your kindness you donated a little more than \$6,000.00 to the mission. In the light of today's Gospel, your "loaves and fishes" donations will multiply many times over to positively impact and enrich the lives of the people served by Fr. Liam and his team. This very week, a group of professional Catholics, doctors, nurses, pharmacist, construction workers, etc., have traveled as a team to Fr. Liam's mission, to dedicate two weeks of their time and talent to support the building up of the church through taking care of the whole person, body and spirit. This team was founded as a result of their hearing a similar presentation during Sunday Mass, as we did, about the mission of the Society of St. James in Ecuador and Peru. Many years ago, a teaching that came from the Second Vatican Council stated that "the Church is missionary by its very nature." In other words, each one of us, through our baptism. This is not the job only of priests and nuns. And remember, you are a missionary whether you hop on a plane as part of a team "blitzing" a poor mission with professional skills, or when you put a few dollars into a second collection basket, in the knowledge that, while you may not directly see the good your donation will achieve, you are indeed furthering the work of the missionary church. I was greatly pleased to hear that Patrick Klekas has been accepted as a seminarian by Mount Angel Seminary in Oregon, and will begin classes at the end of August. The whole parish is behind Patrick as he answers the call to the priesthood, and we are very proud of him. As Patrick will have no income during his years of formation as a priest, the Knights of Columbus and the Ladies Auxiliary will sponsor a "seminary shower" to

support Patrick. This will take the form of an Ice Cream Social on August 14 and 15. More about that later.

We are excited to hear also that another young man from our parish will begin his studies for the priesthood as part of a religious order, also in August. I don't have all the details yet, but I will post them upon receipt. Let's keep on praying that Prayer for Vocations. Again, in the spirit of today's gospel, our great God will surely multiply our humble prayers and cause great things to happen! God bless, Father Dan

NEW PRAYERS, SAME MASS

Beginning with the First Sunday of Advent in 2011, Catholics around the U.S. will worship using the new English translation of the Roman Missal, Third Edition. We will use this corner to try to cover the small changes before actual use begins.

Present Text

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, **of all that is seen and unseen.**

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, **eternally begotten of the Father**, god from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, one in Being with the Father.

Through him all things were made.

For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven:

by the power of the Holy Spirit he was born of the Virgin Mary,

and became man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;

he suffered, died, and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in fulfillment of the Scriptures;

he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son.

With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

with the Father and the Son he is adored and glorified who has spoken through the Prophets.
I believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
I confess one baptism for the forgiveness of sins **and I look forward to** the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.
