400th Anniversary of the King James Bible

Last month marked 400 years since the King James Version of the Bible (KJV) was published. The KJV's contribution to Christian theology and the English language might be debatable but there is no question about its significance to English speaking Christians who needed the Scriptures in a tongue that they could understand, for study, for prayer, and for liturgical purposes. The KJV was not the first English translation of the Bible. Before the KJV there was the Great Bible (1539), the Geneva Bible (1560) and the Bishop's Bible (1568) for the Church of England faithful (Anglicans). The English speaking Catholics had the Douai-Rheims Bible (DR). The DR Bible was translated by the English College of Douai, France and then published in Rheims, France in 1582.

The KJV eclipsed all the previous translations, both Protestant and Catholic, partly because of the readability of its English. The Catholic Bible was so filled with *latinized* vocabulary that it was unreadable in many places. The KJV appealed to the English speakers because of the quality of its English. But even at that time, late 16th century, a time when the English language was developing in remarkable ways, the language of the KJV was already somewhat archaic. However, the KJV became the preferred bible of most of the English speaking Christians for many years.

There had been much development not only in the translation process but more so in the English language itself since the publication of the KJV. Not only do we have Bibles that are very readable and at the same time relatively faithful to the original Hebrew and Greek texts, bibles have also become less expensive and more available. But the Scriptures remain to be neglected by many Christians, especially Catholics. The Bible is not a museum piece that we lock up in an exhibition case (or we place on our family altar and is rarely read). The Bible, which is God's word, has an alarming tendency to break out of any enclosure and challenge us.

Each summer we have a vacation bible school for children. Why can't we have something similar (without the crafts, but with snacks) for adults. So for four $-1\frac{1}{2}$ hr. sessions (July 23, Aug. 2, 9 & 16) we will wrestle with the word of God. The course will be: A (very) short introduction on the New Testament. So on the 400th year of the KJV, let us try to listen more deeply to the consoling and challenging word of God. - Fr. Hermes
