Dear Members of St. Joseph's Parish:

As we draw near to the end of the church financial year, it is a good time to update you on some financial matters. On Tuesday, the Finance Council meets to formulate a budget for the coming year. As soon as that is finalized, you will have that information. Safe to say we stayed within our budget during the past year, and we were able to complete much needed projects.

The new heating and cooling system for Thomas Hall has just been completed. The existing heating system served us rather well for 32 years, but lacked in efficiency. We had to heat the whole building when at times only the office was in use. The new system, installed by Parker Heating, as approved by the parish Finance Council, is 96% efficient, and we will be able to better control what areas of the building to heat, so as to save energy.

I was hoping that the roofs of Thomas Hall and Mater Dei Hall would last a little longer, but of late they have lost numerous tiles and we are awaiting an estimate.

When promoting the annual Catholic Services Appeal for our diocese of Reno, you might recall me stating my hope that more families might participate, as we as a parish had the lowest participation rate among all the parishes in the diocese, at 14%. Again, my appeal was not that you give more money, but that more families might participate. You responded to that appeal, and we increased our participation to 17%, that is, the number of pledges increased from 209 in 2010 to 263 in 2011. At 17%, we are still bottom of the league, but we are headed in the right direction.

Our parish goal, levied by the diocese, is \$66,404.00. You generously pledged, so far, \$111,072 (last year the total pledged was \$102,395). That is a great increase! Because we exceeded our goal, \$44,668.00 will be returned to our parish for our own needs. Fifteen parishes in the diocese pledged less this year than last year. We increased our pledge from last year, and we are still receiving pledges, and you need to know that your generosity is noted and applauded. I thank you for your generosity.

This parish is not all about money, but we know that we need a good income in order to support our parish life and ministries. You understand that well, as you keep on showing, week after week.
