Dear Members of St. Joseph's Parish,

A man named PEREGRINE, born in Forli, Italy, in 1265, grew up with a strong dislike for the Catholic Church, even to the point of assaulting priests. Once, after a vicious attack on a famous preacher, St. Philip Benizi, he regretted his sin, and turned to religion. He even found a vocation to religious life, and was professed as a member of the Servite order.

Peregrine devoted the rest of his life to serving the sick and engaged in many acts of penance, in particular, standing for hours and hours. This led to his suffering from varicose veins, and this illness worsened and advanced to an open, running sore, which was diagnosed as cancer. His leg was scheduled to be amputated. The man who served others and brought healing to others now needed to be supported himself. He prayed before a crucifix on the night before his surgery, and later, as he slept, he had a vision of the crucified Jesus descending the cross and touching his cancerous leg. Upon awakening, he discovered his wound was healed.

Peregrine was declared a canonized saint in 1726, and he is universally invoked as the patron of cancer victims. The National Shrine of St. Peregrine is in Chicago, at Our Lady of Sorrows Basilica.

With quite a number of parish members suffering from cancer at the moment, you might wish to offer this prayer to St. Peregrine as part of your daily offering:

#### PRAYER TO SAINT PEREGRINE

O great St. Peregrine, you have been called "The Mighty," "The Wonder-Worker," because of the numerous miracles which you have obtained from God for those who have had recourse to you.

For so many years you bore in your own flesh this cancerous disease that destroys the very fiber of our being, and who had recourse to the source of all grace when the power of man could do no more. You were favored with the vision of Jesus

coming down from His Cross to heal your affliction. Ask of God and Our Lady, the cure of the sick whom we entrust to you.

(Pause here and silently recall the names of the sick for whom you are praying)

Aided in this way by your powerful intercession, we shall sing to God, and for all eternity, a song of gratitude for His great goodness and mercy.

Amen.

### **LENTEN REGULATIONS**

Catholics between the ages of 18 & 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday. In addition, all Catholics 14 years old and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday & all the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting means partaking of only one full meal. Some food (not equaling another full meal) is permitted at breakfast & around midday or in the evening.

Abstinence forbids the use of meat, but not of eggs, milk products or condiments made of animal fat.

Abstinence does not include meat juices & liquid foods made from meat. Such foods as chicken broth, consomme, soups cooked or flavored with meat, meat gravies or sauces, as well as seasonings or condiments made from animal fat are not forbidden. So it is permissible to use margarine & lard. Even bacon drippings which contain little bits of meat may be poured over lettuce as seasoning.
