Dear Members of St. Joseph's Parish,

Most often, in today's world, we are most known to others, less personally, through the use of numbers: our social security number, our driver's license number, and the various passwords we use to access our accounts.

Today is Good Shepherd Sunday, after the gospel reading which speaks of Jesus as being the Good Shepherd, and we are the "sheep of his flock." Jesus said, "I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me." To Jesus, we are not known to him as a number, but he knows each one of us, intimately, by our name.

There have always been people with a good memory for names: Napoleon, who knew thousands of his soldiers by name, or James A. Farley, who claimed he knew 50,000 people by their first name, or Charles Schwab, who knew the names of all 8,000 of his employees at Homestead Mill. But can you imagine Christ knowing all His sheep by name? That's billions and billions of people over 2,000 years. No wonder we call Him Master, Lord, Savior - watching over His flock, calling each by name.

In the beginning of World War II, the Nazis commissioned a massive battleship named the Bismarck. It was the biggest fighting vessel the world had ever seen up to that time. Very soon after it was commissioned, the Bismarck sank tons of Allied shipping and allied aircraft. They said that the battleship was unsinkable. But, it was sunk - by one lone torpedo. A torpedo hit the Bismarck in the rudder. As a result it zig-zagged through the sea, unable to reach harbor. It was only a short while before the British navy was able to overtake and destroy it. Floundering on the waters of chaos without a rudder, the Bismarck is a modern-day image of a world without the direction of Jesus the Good Shepherd. Without the Lord, the world is headed toward chaos. But with the Lord there is guidance, direction and purpose in life.
