Dear Members of St. Joseph's Parish,

Memorial Day 2011 might be marked by each one of us with a special prayer and sense of gratitude for those who served their country, and those who made the ultimate sacrifice of their lives so that our freedom could be protected, and extended also to those who live under the threat of tyranny and violence from their own governments. This time of year has become known as the 'Arab Spring,' when we observed thousands of people marching on the streets of their cities seeking to be freed of that which denies them the opportunity to be fully human.

We can sometimes take our own freedom for granted and not fully appreciate at times the sacrifice of the few on behalf of the many. Each day in our country about 1000 veterans from the Second World War pass from this life to the next. Many funerals that we celebrate here in our parish are of such veterans. Our deployed troops in Iraq and Afghanistan continue to give their lives, and many return with horrific injuries, both physical and mental, requiring lifelong care.

You might find the following prayer to be of meaning on this special day of remembrance:

Gracious God, on this Memorial Day weekend

We remember and give thanks

For those who have given their lives

In the service of our country.

When the need was greatest,

They stepped forward and did their duty To defend the freedoms that we enjoy,

And to win the same for others.

O God, you yourself have taught us

That no love is greater than that

Which gives itself for another.

These honored dead gave the most precious gift they had,

Life itself,

For loved ones and neighbors,

For comrades and country - and for us.

Help us to honor their memory

By caring for their family members

They have left behind,

By ensuring that their wounded comrades

Are properly cared for,

By being watchful caretakers of the freedoms

For which they gave their lives,

Follow them to a soldier's grave

Unless the reason is worthy and the cause if just.

Holy One, help us to remember that freedom is not free.

Though their names may fade with the passing of generations,

May we never forget what they have done.
