Lent is here . . . now, what will we do with it?

For some, we celebrate Lent by giving something up, as a reminder of how Christ gave up his life for us. Typically, those who have tried to give something up, admit failing long before Easter dawns upon us. In the midst of personal sacrifice and failure, do we understand Lent any more than we did before?

For others, we celebrate Lent by adding something to our daily routines. Maybe it is family time, Bible Studies, prayer, or other items that draw you closer to God and the gifts we have been blessed with. Perhaps, in doing this, we open ourselves to the greatness of the sacrifice that is made on the cross, but do we understand Lent any more than we did before?

Regardless of whether or not you give something up or add something to your daily routine, Lent is a journey that begins with




