The front window in the arts and crafts portion of the hardware store has a wonderful Easter display, with a large mural depicting a beautiful sunrise. Painted across the rising sun, are bold letters proclaiming the good news, that state simply "He still moves stones!"

Nearly two thousand years ago, the stone was rolled back from the tomb of Jesus. Much to the surprise of Mary, Peter, and the others that had come to pay their respects to Jesus show that the Sabbath had passed, they were greeted by angels who proclaimed the good news, "He is not here! The stones of sadness and grief were moved from the hearts and minds of Mary, Peter, and the others. That burden of sadness, was replaced with great joy, for he still moves stones!

For me, I've enjoyed watching stones move over this past

Spring. It has been a continual reminder that Christ is present even in situations that seem completely lifeless. In order to understand what

stones I'm referring too, we have to turn back to early last fall as we were getting ready to move into the parsonage. I had made the suggestion that some patio pavers be laid by the side door as a spot for our grill.

Scott Dick went to work. He had several stones out at his farm that hadn't been used. He brought them into town. He took his time raking out the area. He dug out the weeds. He raked some more, and made sure that things were smooth and level. Finally, the stones were laid, nice and tight, one butted up against the other, making for a flat, level, grilling area.

However, a few weeks ago, I noticed the stones beginning to shift. It was as if they were

So they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples.

#### - Matthew 28:8

Mary Magdalene and Mary walked to Jesus' grave, expecting to find death. It's understandable. Images of violence filled their minds. Thoughts of their vulnerability and mortality deadened their spirits. Death had become the defining story of their lives.

Instead of death, the women met a resurrection messenger who said, "He is not here: for he has been raised, as he said." As they hurried to tell others, the risen Jesus met them. They were changed. Now resurrection, not death, would define their lives.

Jesus lives! Now resurrection, not death, defines our lives. Jesus continues to meet you in resurrection messengers, just as Jesus met me in Pastor Josephus Livenson Lauvanus, president of the Lutheran Church of Haiti. As we walked through the ruins and rubble that lie in the aftermath of Haiti's earthquake, Pastor Livenson Lauvanus proclaimed, "We will not be defined by rubble, but by restoration, for we are a people of the resurrection."

Baptized into Jesus' death and raised to newness of life we, too, are people of the resurrection. We, too, are resurrection messengers. We, too, are about God's work of restoration.

The world aches to hear the message we have to tell. Sing with joy! Jesus lives! We are a people of the resurrection.

The council of St. Peter's Lutheran Church met in the Parish Hall on March 21, 2011. Those present were Pastor Bailey, Larry Wilson, Karl Mauerhan, Dave Loughborough, Austin Fritch, Doug Michael, Calli Thiel, Cathy Schuller, Joyce Whitney, Suzi McCullough, Ladena Ankney, Jan Mollett, Pat Manahan and Nici Manahan.

**Devotions:** Pastor started the meeting by reading from *Here We Stand*. The reading concentrated on how to confess our sins and receive forgiveness. He then led a prayer to open the meeting.

**Secretary's Report:** Minutes from the February meeting were reviewed. A motion to accept the minutes was made by Larry Wilson with a second from Dave Loughborough. Motion carried.

Treasurer Report: Ladena reported that February had been a bad month for income. This was attributed to the bad weather and the fact that the pastor had been gone two Sundays. A discussion on how to bring in more money followed. While we know that money is tight for everyone it seems that when the congregation knows of a need they always respond. It was decided to put an announcement in the news letter informing the congregation of our shortfall. We do not want to get too far in the hole. We would like to be able to run a balanced budget. A motion to accept the report as presented was made by Dave Loughborough with a second by Cathy Schuller. Motion carried. Ladena then presented the open invoices. A motion to pay these invoices was made by Larry Wilson, seconded by Joyce Whitney. Motion carried.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor will be attending a two day retreat in Columbus. He will be meeting with four other pastors to discuss mission work. He

has decided not to hold the Easter Vigil service this year because of low attendance. He asked if the council thought there would be any interest in a sunrise service on Easter Sunday. After a brief discussion it was agreed that we would like him to conduct a 7:00 a.m. service as well as the traditional 9:00 a.m. service. Pastor reported that there are several people participating in the "walking with Jesus" program during this Lenten season. The pancake dinner that was hosted by the youth went very well. He noted that the Feed Mill had generously donated all the sausage for the event. There was some discussion a possible Saturday evening service. Some type of survey will have to be done to gauge how much interest there would be for that.

**Deacons:** The deacons reported that we will be ordering the Easter lilies from Exotic Scents this year. They will be \$12 each. Ushers and readers will be needed beginning in June.

**Board of Education:** They are still working on organizing and assembling *Care Packages* for our youth that are away at college. It was brought to councils' attention that we are still in desperate need of a Sunday school superintendent.

**Trustees:** Pat, Doug, and Austin repaired the men's restroom, in which the toilet had been leaking and was replaced as well as the flooring.. A remnant was purchased at Wayside Furniture. They reported that the Boy Scouts have started working on the church lawn by raking the stones from the grass. Pat has gotten two bids for tree trimming. There are some dead limbs that need to be cut down. There still some small jobs that need to be finished in the parsonage.
