Some of you wanted Pauline A's recipe for her Cherry Rolls.

Cherry Rolls

1 pkg. Active dry yeast	1 egg
¼ cup warm water	1 ½-5 cups all purpose flour
1 cup warm milk (110-115 degrees)	1 can cherry pie filling
½ cup sugar	¼ cup sliced almonds
½ cup butter or margarine, softened	¼ tsp almond extract
1 tsp salt	

Heat oven to 350. In a mixing bowl dissolve yeast in warm water. Add warm, milk, sugar, butter, salt, egg and 2 cups flour; beat until smooth. Stir in enough remaining flour to form soft dough. (I use a mixer with dough hook). Turn onto a lightly floured surface, knead until smooth and elastic, about 6-8 minutes. Place in a greased bowl, turning once to grease top. Let rise until double or you can cover and refrigerate for at least 2 hours or overnight. Punch dough down. Turn onto a lightly floured surface; divide in half. Roll each portion into a 14x7 inch rectangle. Spread with 1 Tbsp melted butter. Take 1 can cherry pie filling and drain off as much of the juice as you can and spread half of the cherries (to which I add ¼ tsp almond extract) over the bottom half of triangle and sprinkle with sliced almonds. Fold over the top half of dough and seal edges. Cut into 1-inch strips. Take each strip and twist two times and put into greased 12-cup muffin tins. Cover and let rise until doubled, about 1 hour.

Bake at 350 for 15-20 minutes or until golden brown. Remove from pans to wire racks.

Make glaze or frost warm.

Makes 24 rolls.
