Exhibits in the main building were the Spirit of the West: Hall of Exploration and Settlement. They had a Paiute Indian encampment, a hard rock mine, and "old West" town and a buckaroo bunkhouse. The Hall of Plateau Indians: Explore the impacts of settlement and 20th century reservation life while learning about the cultures and traditions that have sustained the Columbia River Plateau people for 10,000 years.

They had a special outside event featuring a Civil War Camp and they explained the life of the soldiers and we also learned about the loading and firing of the guns, and different calls of the

bugler. We walked around the camp and saw the types of food that they ate and how they cooked it, and how they lived everyday life. I even saw a couple of ladies getting their picture taken with some of the soldiers.

Outside they had a Nature Trail that took us by the Lazinka sawmill, mustang corral, Robbins' cabin, a sheepherder's wagon, Cheney pond and the Birds of Prey Center, where they had a porcupine, lizard, snake, buzzard and turtle for you to watch or touch. Those of us who went thought it was very educational and interesting and a well spent 4 hours. Thank you Larry & Anita N for arranging this tour.
